Happy Anniversary! Christie Lodge Enters Its 25th Year!

Just a quarter of a century ago, before the world wide web was around, when facsimile machines were the latest electronic gizmos, when nobody blogged, the good folks at U.S. Home in Texas were busily building what we now refer to as "units" of the Christie Lodge.

The completed "units" were then trucked to Avon where they were hoisted, hammered, welded and coaxed into their permanent locations and collectively became the Christie Lodge!

Our present Assistant Chief Engineer,
Dale Levesque [see more about Dale on
the back page!], was around back then
and recounts, "When I moved to the
Avon area in 1979 there was hardly
anything here. In '80 I was hired by a
local contractor to help with the construction. When I arrived on the job the units
were already in place. We erected the
transitions, installed the siding and finished
the interiors. The Christie was one of the
first large structures to be built in Avon."

The Christie Lodge has tested its mettle and evolved into one of the favorite timeshare resorts in the country. For the

third consecutive year the Lodge has received RCI's distinctive Silver Crown Resort of Distinction designation.

But things were not always as nice as they now are. In the early days the lodge was marketed as a wholly-owned condominium resort. Because of limited success, it was changed to a timeshare operation and units started selling. However, many facets of the resort were still experiencing problems. Its financial health was less than desirable, the morale of the troops needed bolstering, and the Lodge needed some real guidance for a bright future.

Arescue came along in the form of Resort Advisory Group. In 1988 RAG accepted the management contract and overcame the plaguing problems. RAG remains the managing company to this date. Since 1988 Lodge accomplishments speak for themselves.

The CLOA is now very healthy, the Lodge is physically in its best shape ever and the staff is without a doubt the most professional, well-trained and enthusiastic ever in the 25-year history of the place. Our exchange company comment cards are a testimonial to

these claims. The Lodge enjoys regular renovations and major improvements are constantly underway, such as the total remake of the Front Desk area.

In spite of all the progress, the Lodge retains much of its original heritage. Because each unit was planned to be standalone and wholly-owned, there was a need for individual utility billing. Those 280+ electric meters are still functioning in various closets throughout the lodge. As you might imagine, that's a clerical nightmare as we get literally hundreds of electric bills each month that we have to pay. We have been working with Holy Cross Electric for two years on a joint billing study and hope to switch to a better plan this very summer.

Because of the modularity, we can't change the basic unit layout, but renovations have brought the comfort level to a height never imagined 25 years ago. More openness, new furniture, classy fixtures and designs by professionals recognized in the industry have helped us accomplish this miraculous feat. We are proud of our Lodge!

On the personnel front, literally thousands of good people have trained in the hospitality industry by working for us and moved forward to other resorts and even other walks of life. The Lodge has practically been a university to them. Mike Morris, Assistant Director of Operations in the mid-1990s, is now a professor of computer science in Oklahoma and says, "The Christie is so complex and diverse - something exciting is always happening. I learned so much about business, resorts, people and even myself during my tenure - it's helped me in every endeavor since I left!"

Even the temporary housekeepers, like the Jamaicans working under the government's H2B plan, have added warmth and appeal to the Lodge. Witnessing a couple of housekeepers walking through the common area in full song, because

they're happy and enjoying their work, is a sight that can't help but make you feel good. Workers in all departments from dozens of countries have always given us a nice international atmosphere that most guests find very appealing.

The Association is healthy, the Lodge is healthy, the crew is solid - we foresee no major problems around the corner. The present project comes up for renewal in 2022 and we will have many decisions to make in anticipation of that hurdle. But for now, enjoy the fruits of all our labor and of your valued ownership and support.

Knotty Alder Enhances New Front Desk Area Look

One of the first projects taken on by our new Assistant Chief Engineer, Dale Levesque (see more about Dale on back page), was the renovation of our Front Desk area.

Dale and crew faced the desk with knotty alder. Alder is a gorgeous wood widely used in the furniture industry because of its elegant grain patterns and hardness. Knotty Alder will contain an occasional knot (obviously



or why would we call it such?), but the knots are small, smooth, and not open. Knotty Alder finishes have a more rustic or "lodge" look with both clear and knotty grains. It's a top-shelf choice.

The back wall was covered with



slate and the desk was topped with granite. The area maintains its 4-station functionality and is truly a beautifully warm facility that you will enjoy visiting.

While Dale and crew were on the knotty alder bandwagon, they used even more of this fine wood for the posts in the lobby and gave the old "luggage row" outside Charter Sports a new facelift. Hats off to our Engineering Department - they never cease to amaze us with their high levels of skill and craftsmanship.
