Amendment 64 - Legalized Marijuana in



Colorado made history November 2012 by legalizing marijuana under Colorado law. The amendment made the private use and limited home-growing of marijuana legal under Colorado law for adults 21 years or age and older. The state established a system that went into effect in October of 2013 in which marijuana is regulated, taxed and distributed similarly to alcohol and requires the state legis-lature to permit the cultivation, processing and sale of industrial hemp.

Just in case you are concerned, Amendment 64 does not permit the "open and public" consumption of marijuana and it is not allowed to be smoked anywhere on Christie Lodge property.

The Christie Lodge has been very proactive in the possible impacts this amendment may have on our community and recently hosted an informational event entitled "Marijuana Grows in Residential Properties and HOAs". The presentation was initiated by the U.S. Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) and sponsored by the Colorado HOA Information and Resource Center, which is in the Division of Real Estate and falls under the Department of Regulatory Agencies (DORA). Presenting speakers were: Agent Kevin Merrill of the DEA and Gary Kujawski, who is the Colorado HOA Information Officer.

Agent Merrill discussed the problems facing communities in Colorado concerning illegal marijuana grows, the damage to properties and the criminal elements involved in such activities. A live stream of the presentation can be found at: <u>http://livestream.com/accounts/4105485/CAR052416</u>
